Spring term 2 2023

What are we learning this term?

Literacy and Phonics

The children will continue to learn set 2 sounds from RWI, with daily blending, segmenting and reading simple phrases as well as learning our red words.

In Literacy the children will share a book a week using Greg Bottrill's pioneering approach 'The Drawing Club', and writing sentences relating to the text each day.

Maths

The children will be focussing on counting, ordering and revisiting cardinality—knowing that the last number said is how many there are. They will begin comparing numbers and looking at how numbers 7, 8 and 9 are made up of smaller numbers.

They will look at 2D and 3D shapes, creating patterns and begin exploring ways of measuring too.

Our Topic in school this term will be linked to the whole school topic Deadly Diseases focussing on Florence Nightingale

Communication and Language

The children will learn a range of poems songs and rhymes, noticing the rhyming words and suggest alternatives.

In our discussions, children will ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them. We will also continue to work on articulating thoughts and ideas in complete sentences.

Understanding the World

In RE, the children will be exploring the question: What is special about our world and why? We will also observe seasonal changes around us and learn about Florence Nightingale.

Expressive Arts and Design

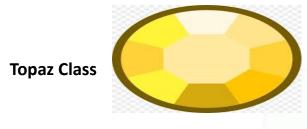
We will listen, move to and talk about music, expressing feelings and responses. We will also explore a variety of artistic effects such as wax resist painting, printing, junk modelling, and weaving.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Being Me. The children will begin to recognise they belong to different groups and communities such as family and school and will explore ways in which they are all unique yet at the same time what we have in common with everyone else.

How can parents and carers support their children?

- *Read stories to your child everyday, encouraging your child to ask questions about the story and to give answers in full sentences
- *Listen to your child read every day and practise the sounds and red words
- *Encourage your child to write using their phonic knowledge and the red words they know
- * Talk about and discuss the natural world you observe

What are we learning this term?

English

Children will read the story Maximus and the Beanstalk and use this as inspiration to write their own story.

Creating poems using expanded noun phrases and similes.

Writing instructions on how to make a tasty salad using imperative verbs and adverbs.

Maths

Year 1—addition and subtraction within 20, length and height, and numbers to 50

Year 2—multiplication and division, money

Plants

Children will learn what plants need to stay healthy. They will have the opportunity to carry out their own investigations into what plants need to grow well.

RE

Who is a Christian and what do they believe?

Children will learn what Christians believe about God and about Jesus as and retrieve digital content through the Son of God. This unit looks at stories about Jesus and stories that Jesus told.

Computing

Animated story books.

Children will develop the skills to create, organise, store, manipulate the creation of their own animated story book.

Topic

History

Children are learning about the life of the influential nurses, Mary Seacole, Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell, what makes them significant and how they have contributed to nursing today.

Music

The children will use Purple Mash to explore harmony and build up musical scores.

Children will learn, sing and accompany the song Zootime (Charanga musical scheme).

PHSE

Being Me

Children will explore the different groups they belong to and look at ways they are unique and similar to everyone else.

PΕ

Real PE—Children will perfect their balancing skills, carrying out balances on the floor and apply this to apparatus.

Gymnastics—Children will learn how to use the apparatus safely, learning balances, rolls and jumps.

DT

Food Technology

Children will be finding out what foods help to keep us healthy and tasting, designing, making and evaluating their own salads as well as learning how to use a range of kitchen tools.

How can parents and carers support their children?

Reading and discussing books 3-4 times per week, counting in 1s up and down from any number between 0 and 100, counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s and helping children to complete their homework.



English

Where would you like to live?

Using the non-fiction text 'Let's go to..', the children will evaluate the positives and negatives of living in different places, read for information, then plan and wite their own non-chronological report to answer the big question

Creating Images

Using poems by Grace Nicholls and James Carter, the children will revise metaphors, similes and personification and draft their own poems

Maths

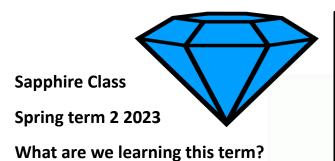
Y4 Area—counting squares and comparing measurements, Fractions—finding hundredths, recognising equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, solving problems
